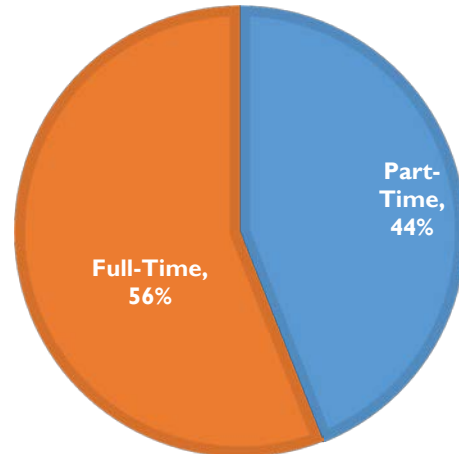

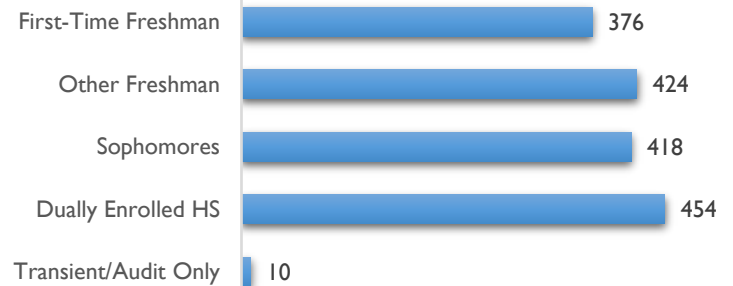

## Student Classification



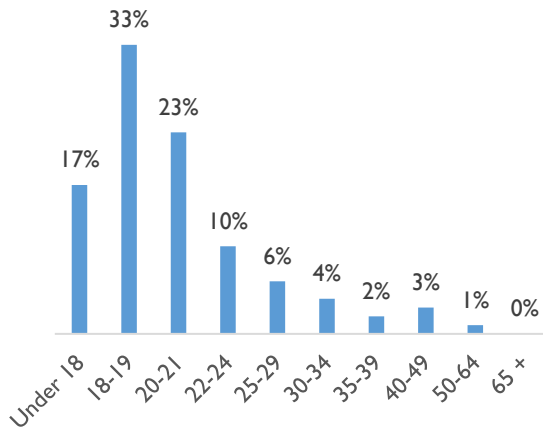
## Residency Status of Students

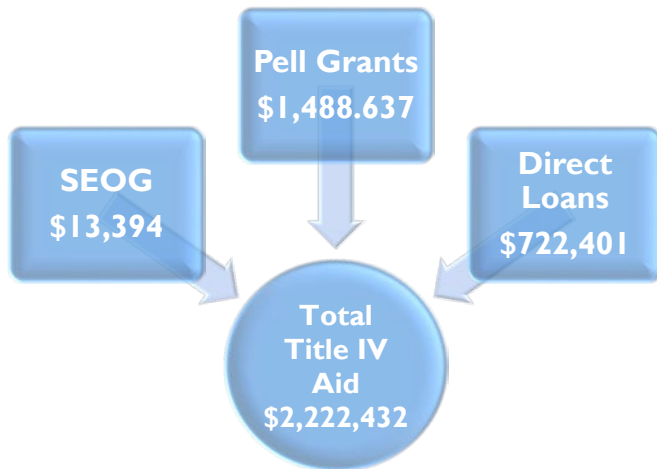

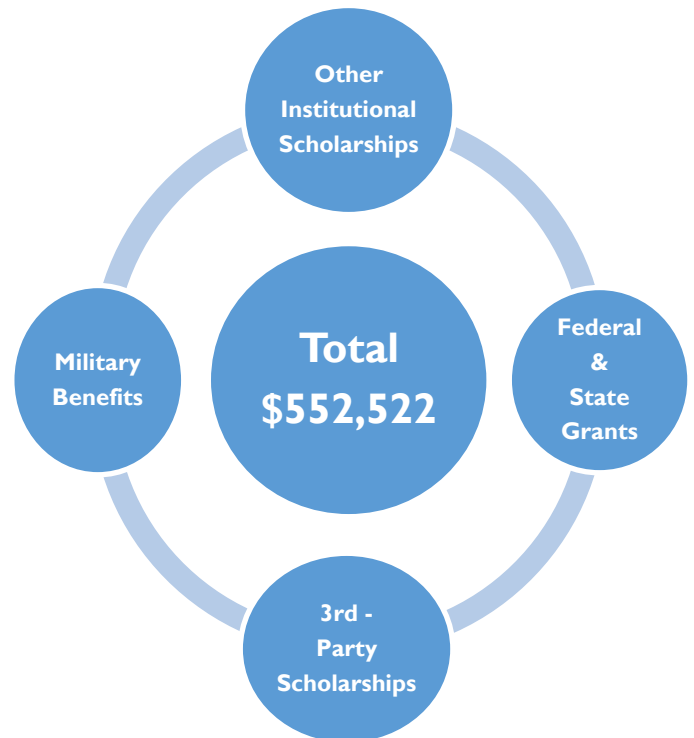
